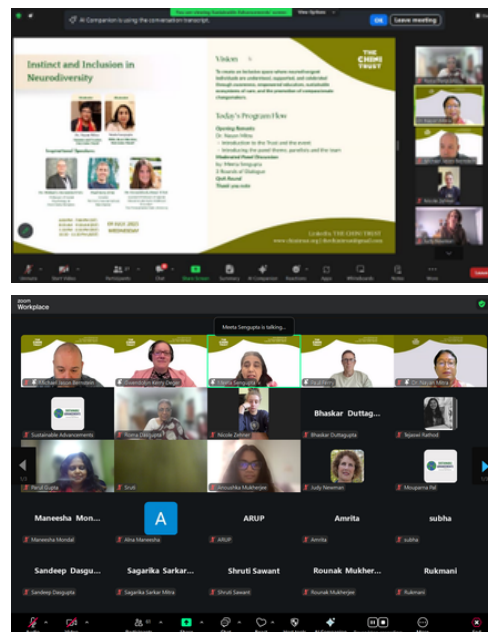

Instinct and Inclusion in Neurodiversity 09 July, 2025

To mark the Founder's Day, The CHINI Trust hosted a global online panel discussion, **Instinct and Inclusion in Neurodiversity**, **bringing together over 80 participants from India, the UK, USA, Australia, and beyond**. The session was opened by Dr. Nayan Mitra, Founder and Trustee and moderated by Ms. Meeta Sengupta, Board Member.

The distinguished panel featured **Dr. Michael Bernstein (Penn State Abington, USA)**, **Mr. Paul Ferry (Will Ferry Soccer School, UK)**, and **Dr. Gwendolyn K. Deger (Penn State, USA)**. Drawing on expertise from psychology, education, and inclusive sport, the speakers explored how empathy, participation, and responsive environments can foster meaningful inclusion for neurodivergent individuals.

2nd Annual Lecture

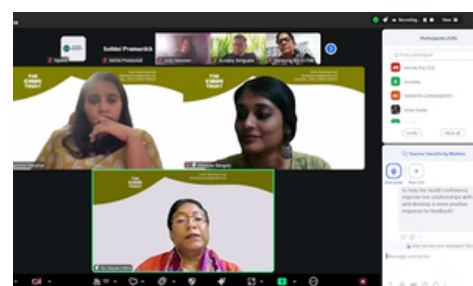
Teacher Sensitivity Matters! 09 February, 2026

Building on the success of our inaugural Annual Lecture, The CHINI Trust hosted its **Second Annual Lecture in collaboration with the National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS), Bengaluru**.

The session featured **Dr. Harshini Manohar, Assistant Professor, Department of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, NIMHANS**, and **Ms. Attrayee Ganguly, Clinical Psychologist and Doctoral Scholar, NIMHANS**. The lecture brought together **over 150 educators, parents, and professionals from India and internationally** to explore how greater understanding of neurodiversity can help create responsive and inclusive classrooms.

Participants engaged with practical strategies for supporting diverse learners and discussed the critical role teachers play in fostering belonging, confidence, and participation for every student.

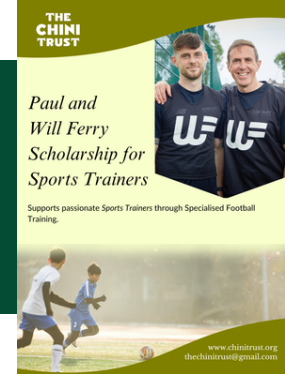
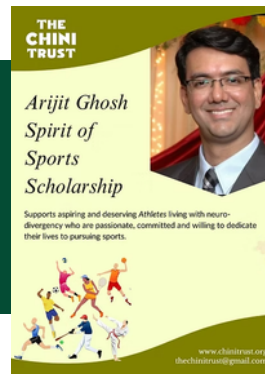
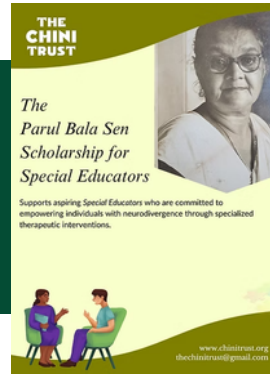

Impact Highlight 🏆

Launched in 2025, the Paul and Will Ferry Scholarship for Sports Trainers, in collaboration with its India partner Sustainable Advancements (OPC) Private Limited, promotes accessible, inclusive, and equitable sporting environments for children and young people in India.

A key highlight was a six-day intensive football training programme conducted in January 2026 by **Paul Ferry alongside UK-based coaches Tom Feighan and Adam Rowles, engaging over 60 players, coaches, and support staff through technical training, tactical learning, and coach education.**

During its first year, the programme reached over **210** children through grassroots football initiatives. With the expansion of support to girls' football development, its reach now extends to over **228+** participants reinforcing a commitment to gender-inclusive participation in sports.

Sustainable Advancements strengthened the evidence base through a second baseline study focused on girls' participation and the successful completion of its first year of monthly monitoring and evaluation. Early findings indicate improvements in technical awareness, coaching capacity, game understanding, and participant confidence.

The programme's impact is further reflected in the achievements of Urchin Saha and Priyanshu Naskar, who represented West Bengal as U-14 National Sub-Junior Champions.

Impact Highlight

The inaugural Renu Dasgupta Memorial Prize recognised two outstanding educators whose work has transformed lives through inclusive education. **Smt. Subarna Ghosh, Founder of Nalini Vidya Mandir, Odisha**, was honoured for her lifelong commitment to advancing education for tribal girls, while **Smt. Maitrayee Mazumdar, Principal of The Turning Point–Rupnarayanpur Branch**, was recognised for her dedication to empowering children with special needs through inclusive and life-skills-based education.

Each recipient was awarded INR 25,000/- and a Certificate of Recognition. The Trust also acknowledged three Highly Commended Nominees whose work continues to inspire equitable and inclusive educational practices across India. Nominations for the Renu Dasgupta Memorial Prize 2026 have now been opened, extending the opportunity to celebrate educators creating meaningful change in the lives of their students.

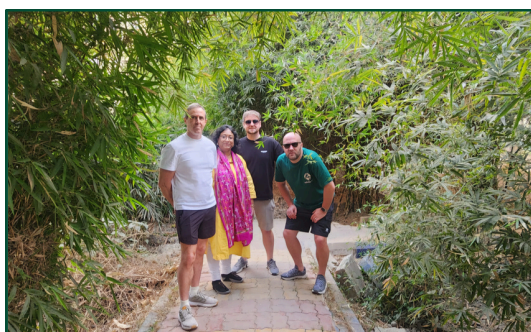
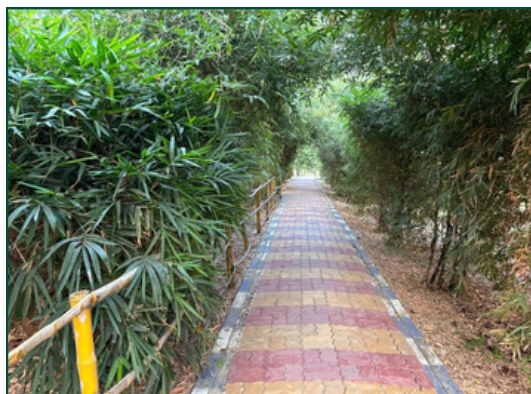
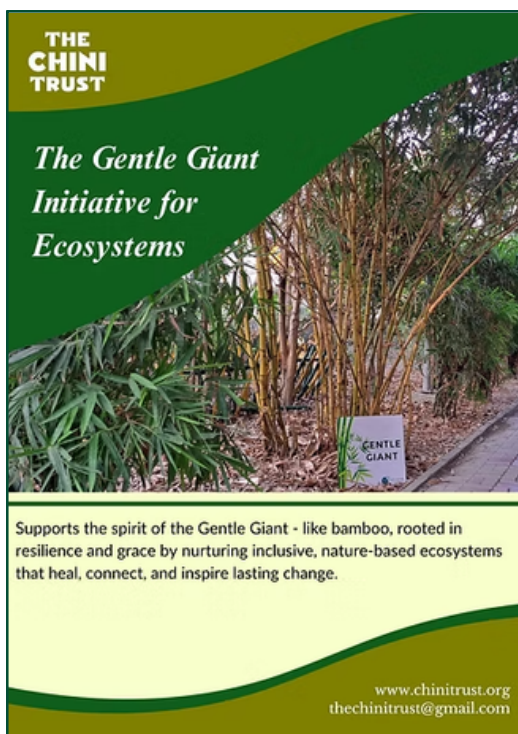

Nature, Well-Being, and the Gentle Giant Initiative

A growing body of research suggests that spending time in nature can have significant benefits for mental well-being. Studies have shown that even short periods spent in green spaces can help reduce stress, improve mood, lower anxiety, and enhance overall quality of life (Kotera et al., 2022; Harvard Medicine, 2024). Researchers have also found that natural environments help restore attention, reduce mental fatigue, and support emotional resilience, making nature an increasingly recognised component of holistic health and well-being.

Importantly, these benefits are not limited to forests or remote landscapes. Parks, community gardens, and tree-lined pathways can also create opportunities for reflection, connection, and restoration. As evidence continues to grow, healthcare professionals and researchers are increasingly advocating for greater access to green spaces as an important contributor to both individual and community well-being (Harvard Medicine, 2024).

At The CHINI Trust, this understanding is reflected in the Gentle Giant Initiative, an ecological effort under our vision to create and replicate ecosystems of change. The initiative recognises that healthy ecosystems not only support biodiversity but also contribute to healthier, more connected communities. By nurturing green spaces and encouraging environmental stewardship, the initiative seeks to strengthen the relationship between people and the natural world.

In 2025, **Ms. Pallavi Salvi** became a patron of the Gentle Giant Initiative and sponsored a grove of bamboo trees at Green Verge located in Kolkata, India in memory of her late husband, Arijit Ghosh – a man remembered for his quiet strength, kindness, and gentle spirit. In a touching reflection of his legacy, the bamboo under her care has grown to become among the tallest on the land.

Her support extends beyond the planting itself. Through her continued commitment to the maintenance and nurturing of the grove, a deeply personal act of remembrance has become part of a larger living ecosystem. Today, the bamboo grove stands as a symbol of resilience, renewal, and the enduring connection between people, communities, and nature.

Internship Programme

In 2025, The CHINI Trust launched its first Internship Programme, engaging students from Psychology background in research, outreach, documentation, and inclusion-focused initiatives.
